PROTOCOLS FOR CONTROLLING COVID-19

Based on the Florida Department of Education Guidelines

Greetings LPBS families,

We ask students and staff to wash your hands frequently and avoid touching your face. We will disinfect each classroom daily. Children with COVID-19 generally have mild, cold-like symptoms, such as fever, runny nose, and cough. Vomiting and diarrhea have also been reported in some children. Parents should continue to monitor their child's health and the health of their families for COVID-19 symptoms. Those who become ill are required to stay home and contact their medical practitioner. Your medical doctor, in consultation with public health officials, will determine appropriate care and whether testing is necessary. If your child has been exposed to or diagnosed with COVID-19, please report this to the school office immediately.

If your children have been exposed to someone that has had a positive COVID test result, then the following must be followed before they can return to school:

- 1. If they have no COVID-19 symptoms, the student may remain in school, or the parents may choose to have the student stay home for a maximum of 7 days.**
- 2. If the results are positive or there are COVID-19 symptoms, then you child is required to quarantine (stay home) for 10 days. At the end of 10 days, a negative test result is required before they can return to school. Or if your child receives written permission from a healthcare provider to return to school.**
